
What are free bingo rooms?

Free bingo is ubiquitous – all you need to do is to play one or two bingo games online or watch TV commercials to understand it. You probably haven't realised it before, but free bingo has been around for some time. There are bingo computer games and even social media sites such as Facebook offer numerous free bingo games online that have free bingo funds attached to them. There's nothing like that feeling of playing your favourite bingo game on Facebook and winning, but there's a catch... On Facebook bingo, you can't withdraw any of the funds, and that's where the difference lies. With **free bingo online**, rooms offer prizes with 'real' money, not credit.

What exactly are free bingo rooms?

If you play smart and have a bit of luck, free online bingo can work for you. There are some sites that offer a daily ration of 'free' coins for those bingo members who're fully registered. These free coins allow you to purchase **free bingo tickets** to play a couple of games. Playing this way is fun and totally free, but the jackpot prize is usually small (just a couple of quid at the best of times). But if you do the maths, all it takes is to win a few different bingo games online with your free credit for your winnings to gradually build up. Unfortunately, the money you win from your free credit won't be eligible for withdrawal with all online bingo sites; however, nothing's stopping you from using this money to buy more tickets, thus allowing you to withdraw the cash to your real bank account next time. Each site you visit and play bingo on is different when it comes to their rules and withdrawing winnings, so it's absolutely imperative you read the site's terms and conditions first. Another type of free bingo is just like the name suggests, it's totally free. It doesn't involve any form of credit or coins. There are usually two versions of this game – one for bingo players who pay and the other for ones who wish to spend nothing. There's no real difference other than those who are playing for money have a chance of going for bigger jackpots instead of just a couple of pounds.

The choice is yours, so take your pick

A number of online bingo sites just have one bingo room for free, but then there are of course the exceptions. Bigger, more established bingo sites online sometimes make it even more 'real' for their players, offering more than one free bingo room to play in. Of course, these sites also offer a variety of different bingo games with different ball numbers. Some of these bingo rooms will be totally free whereas others may request funded players. In the long run this isn't going to affect your finances – remember all of these games are free. The same rules apply as above – those funded players will have a chance to win a

bigger jackpot in comparison to the non-funded players. Online bingo sites sometimes offer **great promotions** regarding their already free bingo games, for example it's not unusual to see some sites offering large one-time jackpot prizes. In some cases you might have the chance of winning £50 or maybe more, so keep your eyes peeled.

Is there a difference with no-deposit free bingo welcome bonuses?

Yes - when a player joins a new bingo site online, they'll be often given a small **welcome bonus** – it's the sites way of enticing them. For example, when a new bingo player signs up, they may be given 'x' number of days to play as much free bingo as they desire. Any money they might win throughout their welcome period will be given to them as part of their welcome bonus. Bingo sites usually have set times for their free bingo rooms, and you won't be able to access them 24/7, so, you'll need to do some research and find the best sites that offer free bingo and the times you want to play bingo online. It's very difficult to make yourself rich through free online bingo games because the **jackpots** are usually too low, but it's still a great opportunity to practice and have some fun at the same time.
